Proposed Plan Change 60 to the Manawatu District Plan: Designation Decisions by Spark New Zealand Trading Limited

I refer to the Manawatu District Council’s recommendations on the designation by Spark New Zealand Trading Limited (Spark) to be rollover with minor modification as part of Proposed Plan Change 60 to the Manawatu District Plan. The recommendations are set out in Schedule 9.1 Designation of Chapter 9 of the Council’s decision notice of the 4 April 2017 and received by Spark on 12 April 2017.

Reasons for Decision

1. The minor changes to the designation are to clarify that Spark has a secondary designation. Chorus has the primarily designation.
